WE HAVE A NEW PROVINCIAL

(ANS - Rome) - On Dec. 22, 2022, the Rector Major, Fr. Ángel Fernández Artime, with the consent of the General Council, appointed Fr. Václav Klement as Superior of the Southern Africa VP (AFM) for the six-year term, 2023-2029.

Fr. Klement was born October 7th, 1958, in Brno, Czechoslovakia, and began his Salesian consecrated life during the former totalitarian regime. He made his first profession in 1982, then left his country for Italy, crossing the Alps to pursue his second vocation as a missionary *ad gentes* for the Africa Project. At his perpetual profession in Rome in 1985, he was incardinated at the Vice-Province of South Korea, and immediately after his priestly ordination on May 25, 1986, he began his missionary life in Seoul on August 11, 1986.

During his 16 years of missionary life in South Korea (1986-2002) Fr. Klement was engaged in pastoral care for at-risk youth, in a secondary school as a catechist and then as rector of Seoul's "Mother House" of Daerim dong. In 1996 he was appointed Superior of the Vice-Province of the Holy Korean Martyrs.

During the 25th General Chapter (2002) Fr. Klement was elected as the first Councillor for the newly formed East Asia-Oceania Region. After six



years, he was elected at GC26 (2008) as General Councillor for Missions. Then, at GC27 (2014) he was again elected as Councillor for the East Asia-Oceania Region. After GC28, in May 2020, the Rector Major appointed him as Extraordinary Visitor "*ad nutum et pro tempore*," and to date, he has been making the Extraordinary Visitation to the Vice-Province of Zambia (ZMB) and the Provinces of Poland-Pila (PLN) and East Africa (AFE).



THE INSTALLATION

(ANS – Johannesburg) – On March 15, the last day of the 2022-2023 Extraordinary Visitation of the AFM Vice-province of South Africa, Lesotho and Eswatini, the installation of the new Superior took place at the Bosco Youth Centre in Walkerville, Johannesburg. During two morning sessions, Fr. Alphonse Owoudou, Regional Councillor for the Africa-Madagascar Region, shared his insights and recommendations. Presenting the Road Map of the Rector Major to the newly appointed Superior Fr. Václav Klement and his Council for 2023-2029, Fr. Owoudou underlined many positive charismatic realities and some concrete ways for the charismatic relaunching of the Vice-province. AFM Salesians are called to share a long tradition of local missionary volunteers with 13 other African provinces along with other creative ways of youth ministry.

At the same time, the Regional Councillor encouraged the 25 confreres present to foster greater family spirit and more radical ways of religious life, especially to heighten the sense of belonging to one provincial community.

After two morning sessions with the Provincial Council and the assembly of rectors and confreres, the evening Eucharist was celebrated with the profession of faith of Fr. Vaclav and the thanksgiving to the outgoing superior, Fr. Joy Sebastian.

For the occasion, the church was packed with the faithful. All the rectors and directors of the Viceprovince's communities, several Salesians, Daughters of Mary Help of Christians, as well as some Missionary Sisters of Mary Help of Christians, Salesian Co-operators from all three AFM member countries and young people who participated in local youth volunteer projects in the past years, in the areas of vocational training or youth ministry.

In his homily to the 50 members of the Salesian family and young people, Fr. Alphonse traced the recent path of the AFM Vice-province, enlightened with faith and Salesian charismatic renewal.

The last part of this festive day was the meal offered to all participants, followed by the joyful family academy with contributions from all the SF groups and the lay volunteers. All present, were grateful for the wonderful hospitality of the Walkerville community (Rector Fr. Jonathan Daniels) with their SDB, lay mission partners, and volunteers. Among the activities he was able to experience with the young people of the school was a sports morning at the Don Bosco High School in Manzini, in the "Mavuso Sports Centre," where teachers, coaches, and students were busy with a liturgical animation, several speeches and the chance to appreciate the sports prowess of the young

Swazis, especially in sprint and long-distance races. eSwatini is the second largest of the three countries that make up the Salesian Vice-Province of Southern Africa (AFM). A small kingdom among the fifty or so states of Africa, a Salesian "nursery" or hub where many of the elite have passed through Salesian schools and "Don Bosco Youth Care," and a real challenge today to give the same opportunities to flourish, to the young, the real "leaven" for the eSwatini and Africa of tomorrow.

NEWS FROM THE SALESIAN INSTITUTE - CAPE TOWN



The students did groupwork as an icebreaker, they had to create a dress made from newspaper, once they were done and satisfied with their garments, we had a mini fashion show for the class to show off their creations.

The students started off with perfecting the simple running and back stitches on paper with patterns for them to follow with a needle and thread, once they were confident and I could see by the neatness if they were ready to move onto using fabric instead of the paper, they were allowed to move on. By Wednesday the entire class was on the level of using fabric. There are a total of 5 pages each for the students to complete. By Friday 3rd March, a total of three students were ready to move onto working on the industrial sewing machine.

I would like to highlight the dedication of every single student in this cohort so far, throughout this past week I have been asked multiple

times if I can stay after class so they can finish up what they are doing, they are enthusiastic, the class is extremely interactive. There is a great need however, for more sewing machines, and I have to make sure that the students don't all need a sewing machine at the same time. Some students have to sit around on chairs and wait for others to finish. The exercises on the machines usually take days or a full week to complete, and it is a challenge to make sure that the students don't all move at the same pace. They are extremely enthusiastic, and it is difficult to make them wait their turn to use a machine.

SUCCESS STORY LLUWELLYN SOLOMAN



Lluwellyn is a 34-year-old man, who has had a difficult journey in life. He first encountered the Waves of Change programme in 2015. His teenage years well into adulthood were marked with turmoil as his parents did not create the ideal environment for a child to thrive in. His father was involved in gangsterism, and his mother was a drug addict. He was then led onto a life of active gangsterism, going in and out of prison, belonging to one of the number of gangs, notorious in Cape Town prisons.

A significant incident led Lluwellyn to make a change in his life. He was living in a brothel with his girlfriend whose mother was the brothel owner. One night, on his return to the brothel, he discovered

there had been a gruesome attack on some of the girls working there. This was a turning point; he recognised that the life he was living was becoming too dangerous. He left, but without a safe place to go to, he decided to live on the streets and slept under a tree in front of the Waterfront by the harbour for weeks. A good Samaritan offered him lodging on a fishing vessel docked in the harbour, but he was unable to work on the vessel as he did not have the correct paperwork and training. He was then referred to the Salesian Institute Youth Projects Waves of Change Programme, where he participated in the 2 week Life Skills programme. Filled with anger and a bad attitude he was asked to leave but told he was welcome back when he was ready to commit.

Covid-19 lockdown then happened, preventing Lluwellyn from pursuing the maritime training and he could only resume his efforts in 2021, when he successfully completed the Life Skills programme. Waves of Change assisted him to complete the required maritime training and obtain his Seaman logbook.

His next battle started, as weeks on end, as he waited at the harbour and no employment was forthcoming. Out of desperation, he returned to the Waves of Change Programme asking for assistance. The Waves of Change Programme facilitator saw the potential in Llewellyn and put him forward to MSC Cruise Lines, who were recruiting at the time for an interview.

Lluwellyn embarked on MSC Cruise Lines at the end of October 2022, on his very first contract, and was on his way on a flight to Italy to join the Cruise Liner. His endurance and perseverance paid off, and Lluwellyn has a bright career ahead of him.



Full of expectation and excitement, Lluwellyn promised to keep us updated on his career developments.





SALESIAN SISTERS FMA

SOME HISTORY COUPLED WITH GOOD WORKS. THE HOUSE IN BOOYSENS IS 120 YEARS OLD THIS YEAR



The house in Booysens, 53 Melville Street, was built by Lord Sumner in 1903, where he and his family lived. His daughter, Maud Sumner, became one of South Africa's most famous artists. The house was given to the St. Vincent de Paul Society who sold it to the Salesian Fathers, who used it as a hostel for young men. In 1966, the Salesian Sisters bought the house from the Salesians of Don Bosco, who moved over the road to 66 Nelson Road. In



1967 the Sisters started the Pre School in the house. The first block of the Pre School was built in around 1977 and the second block was completed in 1980.

The school catered for 120 children. In 2017 the school opened to the Junior Primary classes and now has two Grade R's two Grade 1's, 2's and 3's. Many Sisters have passed through this

community. Catechism classes have been held in the classrooms every Saturday morning. And now also on Sunday mornings, for the four groups attending Confirmation classes. Sr Colleen van Heerden and Sr



Patricia Finn have trained the Catechists, as well as running the RCIA programme for the last forty years plus. The Sisters were also running the oratories and different youth groups, as well as different choirs in Sr John Bosco Parish Robertsham and the Booysens Chapel of the Salesians of Don Bosco. Presently there are four Sisters in the Community.
