

The program started at 07h30 and moved later to the school hall where Ms. Margaret addressed the learners: "At Learn To Live, this is our 3rd year

celebrating World Peace Day, the first of which took place in 2013. The theme this year is "Partnerships for Peace - Dignity for All." "Our partnership is firstly amongst ourselves. Everybody at this school has to become a partner of
