who has become the 10th Successor of Don Bosco. He courageously, generously accepted his unexpected election by the 220 General Chapter members. Since he had never been a member of the General

Council, he never expected he would be elected as Rector Major. In him, Don Bosco's fatherliness continues. The Rector Major is the head of a large international family, spread through 132 countries of the world, with 30 groupings at the service of young people, which enjoy full autonomy within the communion of the Salesian Family.

Fr Ángel is 53 years of age. He was born 21 August 1960 in North-western Spain. In an interview recently, his mother Maria said that her husband has worked as a fisherman and she sold the fish he caught. "One day, when Ángel was nine years old, a Salesian Co-operator who was a good friend of our family, asked him if he wanted to go to study with the Salesians 200 kms away from home. Ángel said he would think about it. The following year, when he was ten, he took the decision to accept the offer to go study at the boarding school. Four years later he had the choice of returning to his hometown to finish High School, but he didn't want to. He wanted to remain at the Salesian boarding school."

Replying to a question whether Angel got into mischief when he was a boy, his mother said that "he was so good that he never did – he was a real angel! When he was born, he didn't cry and we were very worried. But eventually when he did burst out crying, he didn't stop until he was three! He had a hard childhood, because he was alone for many hours at home, while we worked at the fish market."

He was ordained priest on 4 July 1987. He has served as Youth Ministry Delegate in his province of origin, then as Rector of a school and member of the Provincial Council, then Vice- Provincial and, from 2000 to 2006 he was Provincial of León province. In 2009 he was appointed Provincial in Argentina-South. During that time he got to know the then Archbishop of Buenos Aires, Cardinal Jorge Mario Bergoglio, now Pope Francis, and worked with him. He has a Doctorate in Pastoral Theology and a Masters in Philosophy and Pedagogy. Shortly before the General Chapter he had been appointed Provincial of a newly formed megaprovince in Spain. Now he has an even bigger responsibility!

DON BOSCO EDUCATIONAL PROJECTS - GAUTENG SUPPORTING GIRLS AND BOYS AT RISK



The Laura Vicuna Educational Centre (Primary School Level) which is an entity of the Don Bosco Educational Projects, was started in response to the need to give out-of-school at risk children an opportunity to be educated like all other children of their age. Many of these children are

too poor to clothe themselves appropriately to go to the main stream school. Some come from child-headed families; some live with elderly grandparents who do not

have the means to care for them as they would wish, while others come from dysfunctional homes and are deprived of the love and care of happy families. Many have dropped out of main-stream education because they were unable to keep up due to malnourishment.

The Centre provides a basic

integral education, food, nutrition, health and social care to these children. Through



the care and education they receive, they are enabled to reclaim their self-respect and confidence. Then there is the possibility that those youth, who are of an acceptable age, will be accepted into the Declan Collins Skills centre, for training in an employable skill. The day-to-day running of the project is dependent on charity donations to provide food, clothing, books, stationery and all the

normal requirements of school children.

While the Salesian Sisters work with both indigent girls and boys, it is the girls who need that special attention in a society that has high incidents of sexual abuse and rape of females, whatever the age.
