

SALESIAN CO-OPERATORS CELEBRATED 140 YEARS ON 9 MAY

On this day in 1876, the Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord, Don Bosco's project to form a lay branch of educators committed to the salvation of the neediest young souls received the seal of Pope Pius IX. The Association of Salesian Co-operators now has over 30 thousand members in about 1,400 local centres in 11 regions of the world. When, in April 1876, Don Bosco went to Rome to submit the final draft, he accepted the Pope's suggestion not to set up a separate institute for female co-operators but to merge

them into a single formation. "They are by natural inclination more effective and enterprising than men. Excluding them, would deprive [the Association] of its most valuable help," said the Pontiff (MB XI 73-74). Don Bosco welcomed the pope's suggestion and amended the text.



FIRST SEMINAR ON SALESIAN FAMILY SAINTS IN ROME





During the month of April a historical Seminar on Salesian Saints was held in Rome. The theme of the seminar was divided into three sections:

To know and to make known the Salesian saints and those who are in the process for beatification and canonization; To imitate our Saints, and to pray to the Salesian Saints and to help others to pray to them.

The seminar was specifically for vice-postulators, promoters and collaborators of causes, for members of the Salesian Family, and for people of the places where the candidates for sainthood were born, have lived or where there is a lively devotion to them. Presently, the Salesian Family has Saints (9), Blessed (117), Venerable (14) and Servants of God (27), making a total of 167.

Today the <u>ORATORY IN HA CHAKA</u> was re-opened officially. The Salesian Sisters are taking the responsibility to see that the children and young people will be well attended with a week-end oratory.

Ha Chaka is an out-station of the parish. It is not far from Maputsoe (5kms) and it is the centre for other many villages around it. The youth have no form of entertainment during the week end, therefore they are prone to hang around with the wrong crowd, and children risk their lives spending time on the river which divides Lesotho from South Africa.

The first day of the oratory was a great success. There were many happy children and young teenagers who participated in all the activities that were presented to them. There were 7 young leaders from the same village (pupils of Sr. Boniface) who really showed a great commitment and enthusiasm in the activities.

FR IVO PISACANE BORN 12-4-1928 DIED 24-4-2016



Eternal rest give unto him O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon him, may he rest in peace.



Father Ivo was born in Scotland. As a teenager he went to a Salesian boarding school in Shrigley, England. He applied to join the Salesians at the age of 20 and after his ordination he was sent to South Africa, where after his studies he taught the boarders at St John Bosco College in Daleside.

He then taught for several years in Lansdowne before returning to Daleside as Rector. He continued to teach at Daleside where he was much loved by his pupils who continued to keep in contact with him years later.

When Bosco College closed as a boarding school in 1993, Fr Ivo adapted to parish ministry in Booysens and Robertsham for eight years and then in Lansdowne and Hanover Park for another seven. In 2007 he "retired" to Bosco, now a Youth Centre. In December 2015 he was admitted to the frail care section at Nazareth House. He was admitted to hospital on his 88th birthday, where he died peacefully in his sleep twelve days later.
