Pope Francis in the Basilica of Mary Help of Christians with the Rector Major Don Angel Fernandez Artime

"Dear brothers and sisters,

In my pilgrimage for the veneration of Jesus crucified in the image of the Holy Shroud, I chose also to come to this place which represents the heart of the life and work of St. John Bosco, to celebrate with you the second centenary of his birth. With you I thank the Lord for giving the Church this Saint, who together with many other saints of the region, are an honour and a blessing for the Church and society of Turin and Piedmont, of Italy and the world whole, especially because of the care he had for poor and marginalized young people.





You cannot think of Don Bosco today without seeing him surrounded by many people - the Salesian Family he founded, educators who are inspired by him, and of course many young people, boys and girls, from all parts of the earth who acclaim Don Bosco as "Father and Teacher." You could say so much about Don Bosco! The Lord blessed his work by raising up among you, in these past two centuries, a large number of people whom the Church has proclaimed Saint or Blessed.


I encourage you to continue on this path, imitating the faith of those who preceded you.

BROTHER PETER SIMMONDS SDB Brother Peter passed away on the morning of 28 May 2015, at 87 years of age and 61 and a half years of profession, most of them spent in Cape Town. He was a wonderful model Salesian Brother, and although for the past few years was in poor health, continued to do his bit for the mission of Don Bosco.

Born in Tunbridge Wells, Kent on 22 November 1927, Peter became a Salesian in 1953, and came to Cape Town in the following year. He was instructor, teacher and finally principal of the Salesian Technical High School. After its closure in 1976 he directed the Salesian Press and Repository. In 1989 he set up the "Learn to Live" programme for street children. During the late 1980s the phenomenon of street children was becoming increasingly evident in several of the larger cities of South Africa. The Salesian Institute in Cape Town was at that time

a schoolboys' hostel. Outside of school hours the boys enjoyed swimming, football and other recreations in the grounds of the Institute. Some of these activities could be observed at a distance from outside the entrance gates. Thus it sometimes happened that small groups of

street children would watch wistfully from outside while other more fortunate youngsters were obviously enjoying themselves inside the grounds. They were not a little surprised when, instead of being chased away as was their usual experience elsewhere, they were invited in off the street to join in the fun!

January 1990 saw the opening of the project with some twenty-five boys and five girls; most came from the shelters, but about a dozen attended direct from the streets on which they were living. Numbers steadily increased but also fluctuated owing to the instability of the children's life. Donations from various benefactors made it possible to provide the children with soup and something to eat before departing in the afternoon.

Brother Peter's health began to fail when he reached his eighties and he suffered a great deal in his last years, but accepted this with true dignity, always grateful for any act of kindness towards himself. He continued to keep himself informed of current affairs – especially within the Church and the Congregation.

FATHER PETER DOHERTY SDB Father Peter breathed his last around 13h00 on Sunday 19 July in his own bed at the Salesian



House in Manzini, having been confined to bed for the previous 10 days, at the age of 85. Brother Marko Mhara had been nursing him with some professional assistance, and Fr Joseph Nguyen spent the last night in the same room to attend to him as he was in much pain for the last 24 hours. Father Joseph and I celebrated Mass at his bedside and he received communion a couple of hours before departing for that final journey to the Father.

He had a "good innings" and had served the Lord and his people well through the congregation and in the church, especially here in Swaziland where he spent 47 years.

Father Peter, though highly qualified, was content to be a teacher in the classroom for most of his priestly life, dedicated to the task, conscientiously marking piles of exercise books, unpretentious and never seeking to be in the limelight. His past-pupils hold him in high esteem and their numerous presence at his funeral bears testimony to their recognition for how he helped them achieve their often high prominent position in society. It was truly fortuitous, or providential rather, that seven of them

were able to pray at his bedside minutes after he breathed his last. The Cathedral of Manzini was almost full for the funeral mass presided by the Bishop of Manzini, concelebrated by 8 confreres and a dozen priests of the diocese, most of whom had been pupils of his. A special memorial mass was held in his home parish of Malin Head, which Fr Hugh Boyle presided and Fr Tim Wrenn concelebrated with 5 other priests. May he rest in peace. Father Francois Dufour
