

PAINTING OF MARY HELP OF CHRISTIANS - BY THOMAS LORENZONE (1865-68)



The scene was imagined by Don Bosco who described it to the painter as a spectacle he had already seen. "Mary on high among choruses of angels, surrounded by the prophets and saints. On the ground, the symbols of Mary's great victories and the peoples of the world raising their hands towards her asking for help".

Lorenzone protested that painting such a picture would need a square and a church as large as the largest castle in Italy to house it. Don Bosco resigned himself to reducing the scale of his project, but Lorenzone still needed to hire the highest hall in Turin and started working on the scene. After three years, the great painting was hung in its place in the

almost completed Basilica of Mary Help of Christians in Turin.

Don Bosco described it thus: "The Virgin stands out in a sea of light and majesty, surrounded by a horde of angels paying homage to her as their queen. With her right hand, she holds the sceptre, the symbol of her power, and with the left, the child Jesus with his arms opened wide, offering his grace and mercy to all who call on the mercy of his mother. Around and below Mary and Jesus are the Apostles and Evangelists in a state of ecstasy, exclaiming: 'Queen of Apostles, pray for us' as they



contemplate the Holy Virgin in amazement. At the bottom of the picture, there is the city of Turin with the sanctuary of Valdocco in close up, with Superga in the background. The picture's special value is the religious ideal that makes a pious impression on whoever contemplates it". The painting is an effective representation of the title: "Mary, Mother of the Church", and a great lesson in Marian catechesis. Mary, being Mother of the Son of God, is the Queen of Heaven and earth the whole Church, represented by the Apostles and saints acclaiming her as Mother and Help of Christians.

BENEATH THE MANTLE OF MARY



The Rector Major, Father Angel Fernandez Artime, says of Mary Help of Christians, "We are family and Mary help of Christians is our attentive and consoling mother. She took Don Bosco by the hand and takes ours also to guide us along the paths of this world.

Just the other day I was speaking with a young wife who is going through difficult times. We were speaking about faith and she said to me: "Certainly, I have faith, Father. I intend upon living with and by faith, and I can assure you that every morning when I wake up the first thing I do when I put my feet on the floor is to say my prayer to Mary Help of Christians." As you can imagine, my thoughts flew immediately to Don Bosco and the absolute trust he had in Mary Help of Christians. It was Don Bosco himself who said many times: "The best way to go to Jesus is through

Mary," and also: "Mary has always been my guide. Whoever places his trust in her will never feel let down."

Italy – Theft and recovery of the relic of Don Bosco from Turin

The morning of 16 August 2017, on the 202th anniversary of Don Bosco's birth, was the date scheduled for the ceremony of relocating the Saint's relic which was stolen the night of 2 June, and recovered by the Carabinieri Police of Asti's Provincial Command the following 15 June. The famous relic, containing part of Don Bosco's brain, will return to its original place in the Basilica of Colle Don Bosco during an event that will be attended by Rector Major, and the military authorities who have contributed to the relic's recovery, with the event itself taking place within the meaningful framework of the closing day of the Salesian Youth Movement of Europe Meeting (SYM Confrontation 2017 August 11-16). Surrounded by his young people, Don Bosco returns home.





New Provincial Elect for the Salesians in Southern AfricaFR JOY SEBASTIAN THEKUMCHERIKUNNEL SDB

He will succeed Fr Francois Dufour sdb, from the 1st January 2018. Fr Francois has served in this capacity since January 2007.

Fr Joy was born in Kerala (South West India) on the 14th august 1958, as the 4th child of Devasia and Aley of the Thekumcherikunnel family, parents of 10 children, half of whom became religious and priests. The desire to go to the Missions grew in him during his novitiate year (1976 – 1977), after he saw 4 of his seniors, who had just professed, leave for the Assam Missions in North East India. With the help of the Novice Master and the permission of the provincial, his discernment led him to join the Salesian Province of Assam from his First profession on 24 May 1977.

In 1978, after the General Chapter, there was a call for volunteers to join the

new venture of Project Africa, and he submitted his candidacy to the Superiors. The provincial refused, saying that Assam was already Mission territory, and he added that the Regional said they were looking for perpetually professed members for the African mission!

At the end of his four years of studies in theology, and his Ordination on the 01-01-1986, he again declared his availability to go to the Missions anywhere in the world. Once again the General Councillor for the missions, Fr Luc Van Looy, wrote back, telling him to be a good missionary right where he was.

For 15 years he served in the Province of Dimapur, in north east India, in various roles: as Administrator of the Provincial House, and then of the Post Novitiate, High School Headmaster, curate, in charge of a Non-Formal Vocational Training Centre. Then one day he was asked by a friend and senior confrere who was a missionary in Namibia, to come out to the African Missions as there was a dire need for priests. Fr Joy replied that Fr Van Looy had already refused him permission. But again, answering the mysterious call, he expressed his willingness to the Mission Councillor. By then Fr Odorico, the new Mission Councillor was looking to recruit 125 missionaries for the year 2000, and the 125th anniversary of the first Salesian Missionary Expedition. His Provincial heard from Fr Odorico that he had applied to go to the Missions *ad Gentes*, and that he would be added to this list of 125 if the provincial approved. This put him in a fix and he could not refuse.

Thus in 2000 Fr Joy left India and was sent to AFM (the province of Southern Africa, but not to Namibia!), and the AFM provincial assigned him to Lesotho! That is how he became a member of AFM province, and through the grace of God, he is still here 17 years later, and will be its leader, appointed for 6 years from January 2018!



Priestly Ordination of Christopher Sharpe

Christopher Sharpe was ordained on 15 July at St Joseph the Worker Parish in Bloemendal, Port Elizabeth. A wonderful occasion was had by all who attended the celebration. Twenty-one SDBs were able to make the trip to PE to be present for the ordination of **Fr Chris Sharpe** and the mass of thanksgiving on the next day. The Oratorian community welcomed us with great warmth and 30 priests, many religious, and an impressive number of lay people attended the ordination. The Bishop of Port Elizabeth diocese, Vincent Zungu OFM presided, and was very gracious staying for most of the day. On the following day


